#### **ECHARGING GOALS**

- Reduce time and costs required to produce, approve, and exchange charging documents, incident reports, DWI forms and search warrants.
- Reduce duplicate data entry.
- Increase data accuracy and consistency.
- Enable workflow management and visibility to charging documents and DWI forms.



#### ELECTRONIC SEARCH WARRANT

- Features:
  - Added document type to existing eCharging
  - Role based user rights
  - Electronic Signing
  - Seamless exchange of application and signed warrant within one secure electronic system
  - Warrant Types:
    - DWI (Including Criminal Vehicular Operation/Homicide)
    - General warrants all other investigations
    - 626A (Tracking, pen register etc) Future development
- Not included in Project:
  - Court integration Workflow ends with receipt of judicially signed warrant

#### SEARCH WARRANT FILING AT COURT

- Search Warrant, along with the Receipt, Inventory and Return (and any other necessary documents) should be filed through the MN Courts Electronic Filing System (eFS) portal.

#### OTHER CONSIDERATIONS-SEARCH WARRANT


- Only available to "Law Enforcement Officer" and "Judge" role for search/retrieve in eCharging.
- Prosecutorial Review:
  - As per agency custom.
  - No prosecutor access to search warrants in eCharging.
    - Officers may provide the PDF application to prosecutors as desired via email or other means.

#### DWI DASHBOARD PURPOSE

The goal of DWI Dashboard is to provide a mapping tool for analyzing data from DWI Arrests and Alcohol Related Crashes in order to:

- Improve Public Safety
- Improve resource allocation for DWI enforcement and education



#### **DWI DASHBOARD**

- Provides a map view of DWI related data
  - Crash Reports Alcohol Related
  - eCharging eDWI forms submitted
  - Licensed Liquor Establishments from AGED On Sale
- Searchable by any of the 3 sets of data (Crash, eDWI or License)
- Searchable by any combination of the sets or other fields
- Results viewed on a map or in a table format
- Popups for each mapped event gives details



#### DWIDASHBOARD USES

- Planning of DWI enforcement efforts
  - Law enforcement working outside their jurisdiction shown patterns of enforcement and crashes
    - Direct resources more effectively
- Analysis of Your Agency's Efforts
  - Is enforcement occurring where crashes occur?
  - Are there enforcement gaps, i.e. crashes but no arrests?
  - Routes used by public to avoid enforcement?



#### DWF DASHBOARD UPDATES

- Real-time mapping of DWI Crashes
  - Integration of New MNCrash to Dashboard
    - Mid April 2017 Crashes added nearly real-time
  - 2015 and 2016 Crashes added in Dec '16 and Feb '17
- DWI Arrests Manually Corrected
  - Addresses unable to be mapped automatically
    - E.g. Jail, Bob's Convenience Store, 49/16
  - Goal: Crash Mapping Tool in eDWI form
  - Automate process for adding to Dashboard



#### DWI DASHBOARD - FUTURE

#### User Requested Enhancements

- Export table to Excel to allow sorting, further analysis
  - Work is underway Completion by June 1, 2017?
- Drawing tool to select area for mapping




#### DWI DASHBOARD—THINGS TO KNOW

- DWI Arrests eDWI filed only
  - Dependent on date that agency began using eDWI
  - Only display if geocode (location) can be matched
    - ~45% before manual work to plot more
- Crash Data
  - 2004 to Present
  - Only alcohol related crashes
- If Crash results in eDWI arrest Crash is mapped











## DASHBOARD – VISUAL PATTERNS CRASHES AND ARRESTS OVERLAID





### WHAT IS A "EELONY DWI"?

#### 2013 Minnesota Statutes

#### 169A.24 FIRST-DEGREE DRIVING WHILE IMPAIRED.

Subdivision 1. **Degree described.** A person who violates section <u>169A.20</u> (driving while impaired) is guilty of first-degree driving while impaired if the person:

- (1) commits the violation within ten years of the first of three or more qualified prior impaired driving incidents;
  - (2) has previously been convicted of a felony under this section; or
  - (3) has previously been convicted of a felony under:
- (i) section <u>609.21</u> (criminal vehicular homicide and injury, substance-related offenses), subdivision 1, clauses (2) to (6); or
- (ii) Minnesota Statutes 2006, section 609.21 (criminal vehicular homicide and injury, substance-related offenses), subdivision 1, clauses (2) to (6); subdivision 2, clauses (2) to (6); subdivision 2a, clauses (2) to (6); subdivision 3, clauses (2) to (6); or subdivision 4, clauses (2) to (6).

#### Any conviction of:

- 1. 1st Degree DWI or,
- 2. Any <u>FELONY level</u> Alcohol or drug-related related Criminal Vehicular Operation or Homicide convictions
  - Includes: Death, Unborn child, great bodily harm and substantial bodily harm
    - Not Gross Misdemeanor Bodily Harm

#### WHERE ARE FELONY CONVICTIONS FOUND?

- Minnesota Criminal History
  - The only reliable source
  - Run criminal history on all DWI offenders

Driver's License query alone is inadequate



#### **REASON #1 TO RUN-CRIMINAL HISTORY:**

### Should I charge the driver with a felony?

#### 2013 Minnesota Statutes

#### 169A.24 FIRST-DEGREE DRIVING WHILE IMPAIRED.

Subdivision 1. **Degree described.** A person who violates section <u>169A.20</u> (driving while impaired) is guilty of first-degree driving while impaired if the person:

- commits the violation within ten years of the first of three or more qualified prior impaired driving incidents;
  - (2) has previously been convicted of a felony under this section; or
  - (3) has previously been convicted of a felony under:
- (i) section 609.21 (criminal vehicular homicide and injury, substance-related offenses), subdivision 1,
   clauses (2) to (6); or
- (ii) Minnesota Statutes 2006, section 609.21 (criminal vehicular homicide and injury, substance-related offenses), subdivision 1, clauses (2) to (6); subdivision 2, clauses (2) to (6); subdivision 2a, clauses (2) to (6); subdivision 3, clauses (2) to (6); or subdivision 4, clauses (2) to (6).

# REASON #2 TO RUN CRIMINAL HISTORY

### Should I seize the vehicle for forfeiture?

#### 169A.63 VEHICLE FORFEITURE.

Subdivision 1. **Definitions.** (a) As used in this section, the following terms have the meanings given them.

- (b) "Appropriate agency" means a law enforcement agency that has the authority to make an arrest for a violation of a designated offense or to require a test under section <u>169A.51</u> (chemical tests for intoxication).
- (c) "Claimant" means an owner of a motor vehicle or a person claiming a leasehold or security interest in a motor vehicle.
- (d) "Designated license revocation" includes a license revocation under section <u>169A.52</u> (license revocation for test failure or refusal) or a license disqualification under section <u>171.165</u> (commercial driver's license disqualification) resulting from a violation of section <u>169A.52</u>; within ten years of the first of two or more qualified prior impaired driving incidents.
  - (e) "Designated offense" includes:
- a violation of section <u>169A.20</u> (driving while impaired) under the circumstances described in section <u>169A.24</u> (first-degree driving while impaired), or <u>169A.25</u> (second-degree driving while impaired); or

### REASON #3 TO RUN CRIMINAL HISTORY

- Revealing out-of-state DWI convictions.
- •...too frequently not returned by the out-of-state DL check.



## REPORTING CRIMINAL VEHICULAR OPERATION OR HOMICIDE


Law became effective 7/1/2014

Only required peace officer's BELIEF that probable cause exists to charge the driver with alcohol or drug related CVO or CV Homicide.

Report to Department of Public Safety through eCharging.

#### PENDING LEGISLATION

#### Waiting for Governor signature

- Bill passed Senate unanimously last Thursday
- Bill passed House unanimously last Friday

#### Law will:

- 1. Make blood and urine search warrant test results reportable to DPS.
- 2. Make it a gross misdemeanor crime to refuse to comply with a DWI search warrant.
- 3. Effective date 7/1/2017 (if signed)
