



# Section 402/403 Changes

#### **New Allowable Uses**

- Child passenger safety in underserved populations
- Misunderstanding new vehicle tech
- Recall awareness
- Unattended passengers/vehicular heatstroke
- Slow down/move over crashes
- Unsecured vehicle loads

### Other 402/403 Changes

- Authorizes Automated Enforcement in school and work zones
- Increases BTSCRP from \$2.5 M to \$3.5 M per year
- Increases DADSS funding from \$21.2 million to \$45 million per year



# **Equity Provisions**

- Renews Section 1906
  - Increased from \$7.5 to \$11.5 M per year
  - States can access up to \$1.5 M grant
  - Adds programs, public outreach and training costs
  - States can apply for more than 2 years in a row
- Directs NHTSA to evaluate countermeasures other than enforcement to further enrich CMTW.


- For Section 402
  - Requires HSPs to indicate "meaningful public participation and engagement from affected communities, particularly those most significantly impacted by traffic crashes resulting in injuries and fatalities."
  - Requires TSEP to "foster effective community collaboration"
  - Requires "data collection and analysis to ensure transparency, identify disparities in traffic enforcement, and inform traffic enforcement policies, procedures, and activities."



# **Performance Management**

 Performance measures "must demonstrate constant or improved performance"

 NHTSA shall update 2008 performance measures report

- MOE Requirements
  Eliminated
- 405 Transfer No Changes
- Traffic records, impaired driving, nonmotorized – radical expansion of allowable use
- Traffic records assessment Eliminated



# **New Grant Opportunities**

- New Crash Data Program
  - \$300 M per year
  - Internal NHTSA data efforts
  - NCSA accepted comments on competitive state grants for traffic records modernization
- New grant program for states for vehicle recall awareness programs
  - Competitive; \$1.5 M per year

- New Safe Streets and Roads for All Program
  - \$1.2 B per year
  - Awarded by OST, administered by FHWA
  - Grants directly to local governments to implement vision zero programs

FMCSA


- New CMV grant programs

FHWA

- HSIP 10% flexibility to non-infrastructure projects
- New HSIP requirements related to vulnerable road users
- Section 154 and 164 eligible for DUID efforts
- SRTS Grants with noninfrastructure purposes
