Rahya Geisler reported on the new school bus stop arm camera grant. They have \$10 million remaining and have completed Phase 1 and 2. This is for specific school bus companies. TZD Traffic Safety Culture Taskforce Update

Melissa Hjelle gave an update on the Traffic Safety Culture Taskforce.

- Teams developed with uploaded files and working journal for all to access.
- Goals identified; action plan outlined and included in the working journal.
- 9 virtual visits held thus far with meeting minutes accessible in the working journal; all ideas, suggestions, outside resources and links included.
- Traffic Safety expert Katie Fleming Vogel presented to the team her history implementing TSC and lessons learned; all coordinators have Katie's Traffic Safety Culture book. TSC Book Club will begin likely in the fall.
- Our goal is to identify a topic and create a toolkit/campaigns for our partners statewide to use.
- Each member of the team commits to contributing to the work of the project.
- The first campaign was implemented for Valentine's Day 2022!
- Next preliminary Project "Stay on the Safe Side: Stop at Red" August 1-7, 2022. Adopted from the National Coalition for Safer Roads

TZD Regional Workshop Debrief

Linda Dolan reported on the evaluation summaries. The results showed the following:

- Katie/Jay, Montana State University's presentations were very well received and people appreciated the "fill in the blank" activity that kept them engaged and interested
- Attendees were thrilled to be back in person
- The "What's our goal for 2022 and beyond" was also rated high as well and several people mentioned they liked having some action items they could implement right away.
- Attendance was down approximately 30% from 2019
- 28% of the attendees were "First time attending a TZD Regional Workshop"
- Top Stakeholder Designations were:
 - Engineering 28% of attendees
 - Enforcement 16% of attendees
 - Education 12% of attendees

- o 70 scholarships will be given out in 2022

- Pay for registration and hotel (one hotel sleeping room for two nights at one of the conference hotels if the recipient works fore than 65 miles from the St. Cloud River's Edge Convention Center. All other travel expenses must be paid by the individual attendee or their employer.
- Scholarship preference will be given to individuals who meet one or more of the following criteria: demonstrate a need for financial assistance, have not attended a TZD Statewide Conference in the past, are active in TZD in their region, or can apply learnings from the conference to their traffic safety work.
