

TZD History Toward Zero Deaths Established 2003 Program created in 2003 during a time of increasing 700 traffic fatalities. 600 Persons Killed Unique program that 576 coordinated the traffic safety efforts of the Departments of Public Safety, Health and 400 Transportation. 300 Modeled after Sweden's Vision Zero Program, which 200 began in 1997. 1995 1996 1997 1996 1999 2000 2007 2007 2003

Mission


To move Minnesota toward **zero** deaths on our roads using education, enforcement, engineering and emergency medical & trauma services.








How Finland Put Traffic Crashes on Ice

- The Nordic nation's rate of vehicle fatalities is a fraction of the toll in the US, despite a harsh climate and ice-covered streets.
- Fatalities <u>plunged 50%</u> between 2001 and 2019, when Helsinki made international news for going <u>an entire</u> <u>year</u> without a single pedestrian or cyclist fatality. (<u>Last year</u> there were two, down from 22 in 1990.)





How'd they do that?

- Set Stricter Limits
- Make Speeders Pay a Lot
- Question Every Crash
- Understand the Ice
- Keep it Simple



Another mandatory element on the car? Slovaks have developed a front brake light with the potential to save lives

The green brake light on the front of the car is a novelty that comes from Slovakia. Its main task is to timely warn pedestrians to a braking vehicle.

TOWARD ZERO DEATHS

It is part of a pilot program that's set to expand across the state. State police say the technology would only be used for serious and violent crimes and could quadruple the chances of making an arrest.





That vision is to reduce traffic fatalities and serious injuries to zero by 2030. The WTSC Director is the Governor's Highway Safety Representative, which is a designated position each state is required to have in order to qualify for federal traffic safety funding. The Commission is made up of 26 employees and ten Commissioners chaired by Washington's Governor Jay Inslee.

Message: Seat belts keep me safe so I can experience more of life's moments






In Bar Media




Campaign basics


- Campaigns should be factual and focus group tested
- Community-based, trusted messengers not government
- Do not stereotype or ridicule cannabis consumers
- Myths about cannabis and driving must be dispelled
- Enforcement messages focus on LE's skills to detect impairment, not legality/illegality of cannabis use
- Cannabis-impaired driving is illegal in all 50 states and territories, regardless of legal status of cannabis


