A Little History

- Regions Hospital has traditionally partnered with fire departments to hold community car seat clinics
- 2021 Saint Paul Police requested assistance for a family as part of a traffic citation. The four children were not in car seats.





The Beginning of a New Partnership

What if both organizations could support one another?

- As a trauma center, our goal is to reduce preventable injury
 - Car crashes remain one of the top 3 causes of admission to the hospital across all age groups.
 - Proper use of car seats DOES make a difference by reducing injury severity, hospital admission rates and can prevent a fatality
 - Regions Hospital already had a robust car seat program
 - As a non-profit hospital and the sponsor site for a Safe Kids coalition, we are poised to apply for and receive grant funding to support injury prevention efforts

The Beginning of a New Partnership

- The Saint Paul Police Department is committed to serving the community
 - Community Partnerships Unit
 - Focus on engagement & outreach
 - Toward Zero Deaths grant work
 - Focusing on speed, distracted, DWI, pedestrian, seat belts (including child restraints)
 - Partnership allows us to do more than just write a ticket to someone who may or may not have the resources to obtain a child seat for their vehicle. Officers and community members have had a huge benefit from this work

Various Initiatives

EARLY ATTEMPTS

- General awareness training on car seat safety
 - One session, but prompted interest from others
- Car seat certificates to hand to families identified during traffic stops
 - Was great when it worked, but generally low compliance

CURRENT WORK

- Support SPPD staff to attend the Safe Kids CPS Tech Course
- Implement a Ride Along Program
- Host/Hold community car seat clinic events, with recruitment of families led by the SPPD Community Partnerships Unit

Current Work, continued

CPS Tech Training

- 21 SPPD employees trained
 - 10 PEO's
 - 5 from Community Partnerships
 - 6 sworn officers
- 8 more scheduled to train this month



A Program of Safe Kids Worldwide

Ride-A-Longs (3-4 hour shift)

- 5 completed since starting June 2023
- Caregivers/Adults reached = 100
- Educational Encounters = 58
- Distributed car seats = 37
 - RF Only = 2
 - RF Convertible = 1
 - FF Convertible = 8
 - FF Combination = 6
 - Booster seat = 20

Hosting Community Car Seat Clinic Events

- 9/12/2023: 21 seat checks; 4 seats distributed
 - 100% misuse
- 10/26/2023: 43 seat checks; 15 seats distributed
 - 75% misuse

Future Plans

- Continue with community car seat clinics
 - Community Partnerships Unit poised to offer 1:1 seat checks at any time
- Continue to participate in ride-a-longs
 - NEXT EVENT: November 18, 2023 (National Injury Prevention Day)
- Continue CPST training
 - SPPD certified technicians can provide point of contact education and resource distribution at any time
- Regions Hospital is committed to support training efforts and resource acquisition
- Other ideas:
 - Department wide awareness training? In order to make referrals to the Community Partnerships Unit?
 - Citation forgiveness upon follow through with education?

Recommendations for Others

- Take advantage of TZD funding and the Office of Traffic Safety's commitment to child passenger safety
- Obtain leadership support
- It should be a department wide effort
- Identify your local Safe Kids coalition
- Identify your local Trauma Center, connect with their injury prevention coordinator
- Start small and try it! Fine tune from there.
- Think sustainability. How to keep the work going despite attrition or turnover.
