What's New with Responsible Beverage Server Training? Cleven Duncan, Responsible Beverage Service liaison, Minnesota Department of Public Safety, Alcohol & Gambling Enforcement Division

Most people are aware that it's against the law to serve alcohol to an obviously intoxicated customer, but spotting someone impaired by cannabis might not be so easy. RBST Trainers teach servers to recognize impairment, spot invalid IDs and to make servers aware of the civil and criminal penalties. The train-the-trainer is available to law enforcement, public health organizations as well as Alcohol & Drug community coalitions.
